

# Our vision is a world in which all young people are able to achieve full and productive employment

Workaid is a charity based in Chesham, founded in 1986, empowering young people in Africa (and the UK) to help themselves by developing the skills and knowledge needed to find gainful employment or start their own business. We do this by refurbishing donated tools to a high standard and shipping them to training centres and self-help organisations.



Young people in Africa are the drivers of development and know the solutions to the challenges they face. We work with like-minded organisations in Africa to provide quality vocational training through the provision of tools and equipment. Our tools and starter kits are used for training and the creation of employment opportunities for young people, helping them escape poverty and promote sustainability.

Our Chesham workshop operates with a community of dedicated volunteers who bring a wealth of skills and abilities to refurbish donated tools and equipment. We also offer opportunities in our supported environment to young people with rehabilitation needs, mild to moderate learning disabilities and those facing employment challenges, to learn valuable life lessons and vocational skills.

#### Tools:

saws, routers, planes, tape measures, levels, angle grinders, hand drills, adjustable spanners, lathes, clamps and hacksaws

#### **Sewing Machines:**

antique & vintage, manual, treadle and overlockers

Knitting Machines: manual and electric

### Haberdashery:

dress making fabric, thread, scissors, pins & needles, elastic, zips, buttons and wool

#### **Horticulture:**

spades, forks, lawnmowers, hedge trimmers even watering cans

Workaid offers a unique workshop providing occupational training for local people with mild to moderate learning difficulties. The Hub was established in 2012 and provides a supportive and engaging environment for people with a wide range of needs.

This is managed by an experienced coordinator responsible for planning activities tailored to each individual.

The tasks are similar to those in the main workshop which include cleaning and refurbishing hand tools. Attendees learn valuable life lessons and skills, such as perseverance, patience and teamwork by participating in meaningful tasks and seeing them through to completion.
